


CAL Belle Blanket – Part 1



COLORS:



Material - Superstar od Etrofil in 4 colors:

72192 Orange 3ks = C1 72006 Rust 3ks = C2

77013 Brown 3ks = C3

74065 Khaki 3ks =C4

- the yarns cans find in our eshop <u>SUPERSTAR</u> + hook 5,00mm - 8/0


The colors alternate in the exact sequence as stated in the legend. You can cut and connect the new color after each row – I chose to pull the thread on the back – see below – without sewing the ends.

If you are using wool without alternating 4 different threads/yarns, continue crocheting the pattern smoothly without following the color change.

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ABBREVIATIONS:



CORNER – into the ch3 corner space make – 2dc,ch3,2dc

Pattern

Start with a magic ring, into which make the first base row - ZR1 with color Orange

ZR1 - ch3, 2dc, *ch3 and 3dc* repeat this pattern 2 more times, then make ch3 and close the row with sl st into the third ch from the first (= 3 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 24 stiches)

Next start each subsequent row in the square the same way – moving with slip stiches into the corner created by the ch3 space from the previous row. This will prevent a so-called "crochet seam" in the middle of the work and make the square neater.

ZR2 - connect the color Rust and continue - ch3, dc, ch3 and 2dc into the corner chain space, then make *dc to the nex 3 sts, CORNER* repeat this pattern between th *-* on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 7 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 40 stiches)

Row 1 - connect the color Brown and continue - ch3, dc, ch3 and 2dc into the corner chain space, then make ,,*dc, ch1 and skip1* - this pattern repeat 3 times, dc and CORNER" - repeat pattern between ,," on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 11 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 56 stiches)

Row 2 - connect the color Khaki and continue - ch3, dc, ch3 and 2dc into the corner chain space, then make *dc to each st until the corner and CORNER* - repeat this pattern between th *_* on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 15 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 72 stiches)

From this in each row change the colors in sequence - ORANGE, RUST, BROWN, KHAKI - on the back as stated in the color legend (or cut and join according to the color chart). The rows will be marked in different colors in the text for better clarity.

When you have joined all the colors, on the back of the work, gradually wrap the colored thread that you are going to crochet with - see photo:



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Row-3 – ch3 and ch3 and dc into the corner chain space, "skip1 and to the next st make 5dc-shell, skip2 and make *dc, skip2 sts and to the next st make 5dc-shell and skip2 sts* - this pattern between *-* repeat 1 more time and to the corner chain space make – dc,ch3,dc" - repeat pattern between ,, "on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 19 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 88 stiches)

Row 4 - ch3, dc, ch3 and 2dc into the corner chain space,, then make ",*dc, ch2 and sc to the 3rd dc in the middle of the shell, ch2* - this repeat 3 times, then dc and CORNER" - - repeat pattern between "," on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 23 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 104 stiches)

Row 5 - ch3, dc, ch3 and 2dc into the corner chain space, then make *dc to each st until the corner and CORNER* - repeat this pattern between th *-* on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 27 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 120 stiches)

Row 6 - ch3, dc, ch3 and 2dc into the corner chain space, then make ,,*dc, ch1 and skip1* - this pattern repeat until the last st before the chain space, dc and CORNER" – repeat pattern between ,," on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 31 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 136 stiches)

Row 7 - ch3, dc, ch3 and 2dc into the corner chain space, then make *dc to each st until the corner and CORNER* - repeat this pattern between th *_* on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 35 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 152 stiches)

Row 8 - ch3, dc, ch3 and 2dc into the corner chain space, then make *BPdc to each st until the corner and CORNER* - repeat this pattern between th *-* on all sides of the square and close the row with a sl st into the third st at the beginning of this row. (= 39 sts on each side + 4x corner chain sts = 168 stiches)

Here ends the first part of the pattern. There will be a change in the next part, so stay tuned for the second part.
