

Hat and Fingerless Gloves Olivia

WHAT YOU WILL NEED FOR THE HAT AND GLOVES:

- APPROX. OF 50G YARN BALL <u>PIROUETTE</u>, COLOR 842 (MC) AND APPROX. OF 50G COLOR 708 (CC) BY DMC, 200 G / 500 M, 100% ACRYL
- NEEDLES 4.5MM
- NEEDLE FOR STITCHING AND CLEANING
- LILA POMPOM

Abbreviations:

K-knit

P - purl

K2tog - knit two stitches together

HAT:

Cast on 86 sts for the classic adult size in the usual way with the main color MC color 842 (if you are making a smaller hat, I recommend making a test sample and calculating the number of stitches needed for the desired head circumference). Always knit the right and wrong sides - odd rows always indicate the right rows of pattern.

The color change is always every two rows – start with the MC main color and continue with the contrasting color CC – color 708 – you don't have to cut the thread – at the beginning of the row, always lead the new color in front of the thread with the color which ended. See the video on wrap – OLIVIA WRAP

Knit the patent:

Row 1 (RS) MC: Repeat the patent pattern *K2, P2* until the last two sts, K2

Row 2 (WS) MC: Repeat the patent pattern *P2, K2* until the last two sts, P2 (if you use a different number of starting stitches, knit row 2 as the stitches appear)

Attach a contrasting color CC and knit rows 3-4 same as rows 1-2

Repeat the rib pattern from rows 1-4 2x more times and then add 1 more repetition of rows 1-2 with MC. This will create a thicker patent.

Knit the Olivia pattern:

Row 1 CC: knit all sts

Row 2 CC: knit all sts

Row 3 MC: knit all sts

Row 4 MC: purl all sts

Pattern of rows 1-4 repeat 3 more times

Row 17 CC: knit the pattern *K5, K2tog * until the last 2 sts, K2 $\,$

Row 18 CC: knit all sts

Row 19 MC: knit all sts

Row 20 MC: purl all sts



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Row 21 CC: knit all sts

Row 22 CC: knit all sts

Row 23 MC: knit all sts

Row 24 MC: purl all sts

Row 25 CC: knit pattern *K4, K2tog* until last 2 sts, K2

Row 26 CC: knit all sts
Row 27 MC: knit all sts

Row 28 MC: purl all sts

Row 29 CC: knit pattern *K3, K2tog* until last 2 sts, K2

Row 30 CC: knit all sts
Row 31 MC: knit all sts
Row 32 MC: purl all sts

Row 33 CC: knit pattern *K2, K2tog* unitl last 2 sts, K2

Row 34 CC: knit all sts
Row 35 MC: knit all sts
Row 36 MC: purl all sts



Cut a piece of thread about 20-30cm long (you will also need it to trim and attach the pompom, so choose the length of the thread according to your own discretion), then thread this thread through the remaining stitches with a needle. Join and sew along the side and pull as much as possible at the top. Sew the rest of the thread and trim and attach the pompom.

And the hat is done!

FINGERLESS GLOVES

Cast on 30 for the classic adult size with the CC (if you are making smaller gloves, I recommend making a test sample and calculating the number of stitches needed). Cast on so that you have about 20-25cm of thread left for sewing the gloves together at the end. Always knit the right and wrong sides - odd rows always indicate the right rows of pattern.

Row 1 (RS) CC: knit all sts
Row 2 (WS) CC: knit all sts

Row 3 MC: knit all sts
Row 4 MC: purl all sts

Repeat the pattern of rows 1-4 8more times (if you want shorter gloves, reduce the number of repetitions)

Row 37 CC: knit all sts
Row 38 CC: knit all sts

Row 39 MC: K, second st increase +M1, knit all sts until penultimate and

increase +M1, K

Row 40 MC: purl all sts
Row 41 KF: knit all sts



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Row 42 CC: knit all sts

Row 43 MC: K6, close 4 sts for thumb hole, the rest sts K

Row 44 MC: purl all stitches, adding +5 stitches above the thumb hole – *if* you knit the thumb part, add 3 rows around the thumb hole with a pattern with alternating colors – you can use the method of crocheting the thumb part and do this at the end after closing the knitted part and before sewing the glove

Row 45 CC: K, K2tog, then knit all sts Row 46 CC: K, K2tog, then knit all sts

Row 47 MC: knit all sts
Row 48 MC: purl all sts

Next, repeat the pattern from rows 45-481 more time (if you want shorter gloves on the finger part, do not repeat this again)

Row 53 CC: knit all sts Row 54 CC: knit all sts Row 55 MC: knit all sts Row 56 MC: purl all sts Row 57 CC: knit all sts

Row 58 CC: close all the stitches smoothly in the classic way.



If you are crocheting the thumb part of the glove in the thumb hole – start with MC and make 14 halfdouble crochets, then crochet with CC around the perimeter with 14 BackPost single crochet and one more row of MC with halfdouble crochets.

Cut the thread, clean all the ends up to CC, with which you cast on the basic stitches, and you have 20-25cm of thread, with which can sew the glove on the inside with an invisible stitch. Sew the rest of the thread and clean it and the left glove is finished.

The right glove knit the same way – up to rows 43-44, where you close the stitches on the opposite side, i.e. at the end of the row, so that the hole for the thumb is on the right side of the sewn glove (and therefore from the right side on the left side of the knitted fabric during work).



The set is ready and I believe it will be your favorite. ☺

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
