## ANJA - CROCHET SCARF

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### ANJA - CROCHET SCARF

Who said that sock yarn is for socks only?! Create your own unique scarves using our ARNE & CARLOS Socks & More yarns. These are so much fun to crochet as each square will be completely different from the next.

This pattern is written in USA crochet terms. For the equivalent UK terms, please see the page which contains the descriptions for the chart symbols, as that page includes the UK terms as well.

**Materials:** You will need about 175 grams of ARNE & CARLOS Socks & More 4-ply, 75% Virgin Wool and 25% Recycled Polyamide for a scarf. All our sock yarns will work for this project – but the results will be completely different depending on the effect, and this is something that will really add to the excitement of how the finished project will look like.

You only need a little bit of yarn for edging in a solid colour, so if you don't want to buy a ball of sock yarn for the edging, look in your stash and see if you can find something in a similar weight (fingering).

Crochet hook: 2.5 mm / U.S. C-2

The finished scarf consists of 9 granny squares joined together. There are 2 different options of joining the scarf together in this pattern, choose the one you like the most!

#### Pattern:

**Rnd 1:** Ch 8 and join into a ring with 1 sl st to 1st ch. (Illustration 1.)

Rnd 2: Ch 4 (= 1 tr), 3 tr around ring, (ch 3, 4 tr around ring) 3 times, ch 3 and end with 1 sl st in top of 1st tr = 4th ch. (Illustration 2.)

**Rnd 3:** Turn the work and ch 4, 3 tr = (4tr around ch 3 in the corner, ch 3 and 4 tr around the same ch, ch 2) around. End with 1 sl st in top of 1st tr = 4th ch. (Illustration 3.)

**Rnd 4:** Turn the work and ch 4, 3tr around the ch 2, ch 2, (in the corner 4 tr, ch 3, 4 tr, ch 2 and 4 tr around all ch 2) around. End with 1 sl st in top of 1st tr = 4th ch. (Illustration 4.)

Continue crocheting  $\mathbf{Rnd}\ \mathbf{5} - \mathbf{10}$  around (according to illustrations  $\mathbf{5} - \mathbf{10}$ ) with 4 tr around all ch, and 4 tr, ch 3, 4 tr in every corner.

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#### Finish the next 8 squares by joining on rnd 10:

**1st joining:** Start in a corner with ch 3, take the hook out of the ch and put it into the ch 3 at a corner of one finished square, from the top down, put the hook back into the last ch and pull the ch 3 through the hole and continue with 2 tr back around the ch in the corner of the second square. (Illustration 11.)

**2nd joining:** take the hook out of the last tr and put in in between the 2nd and 3rd tr on square 1, from top down, put the hook back into the last tr and make the last 2tr in the corner on square 2. (Illustration 12.)

**3rd joining:** Ch 2, take the hook out of the last ch and put the hook under the first ch 2 on square 1, put the hook back into the last ch and pull the ch up through the hole, tighten up the last ch and make 2 tr around the 1st ch 2 on the 2nd square. (Illustration 13.)

**4th joining:** take the hook out of the last tr / UK dtr and put in in between the 2nd and 3rd tr in the next group of tr on square 1, from top down, put the hook back into the last tr and make the last 2tr back around the same ch 2 on square 2. (Illustration 14.)

Repeat 3rd and 4th joining until you finished the first group of 4 tr in the next corner.

Last joining: Ch 3, take the hook out of the ch and put it into the ch 3 in the corner at the end of the square, from the top down, put the hook back into the last ch and pull the ch 3 through the hole and continue with 4 tr back around the ch in the corner of the second square and finish the second square. (see Illustration 15.)

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#### Second way of joining the granny squares:

Start with 1 sc around ch in corner, ch 3, 1 sc back around same ch in corner, (in the next group of tr: 1 sc between 1st and 2nd tr, 1 sc between 2nd and 3rd tr, ch 3, 1 sc back between 2nd and 3rd tr again, 1 sc between 3rd and 4th tr.


Around the ch 2, crochet 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc back around the same ch 2) repeat until the ch 3 in the corner at the end. 1 sc around the ch 3 in the  $2^{nd}$  corner, ch 1, 1 dc back around the same ch 3, ch 1, 1 sc around the  $1^{st}$  corner on the  $2^{nd}$  granny square, 1 dc back around the same ch 3, (in the next group of tr: 1 sc between 1st and 2nd tr, 1 sc between  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  tr, ch 1, 1 sc around the ch 3 on the  $1^{st}$  square, ch 1, 1 sc back between 2nd and 3rd tr again, 1 sc between 3rd and 4th tr.

Around the ch 2, crochet 1 sc, ch 1, 1 sc around the ch 3 on the 1<sup>st</sup> square, ch 1, 1 sc back around the same ch 2) repeat until the 2<sup>nd</sup> corner on the 2<sup>nd</sup> square.


In the last corner crochet 1 sc around ch, ch 1, 1 sc around the 1<sup>st</sup> ch 3 in the 1<sup>st</sup> corner on the 1<sup>st</sup> square, 1 dc back around ch on the 2<sup>nd</sup> square. End with a sl st around the 1<sup>st</sup> ch and cut the tread. (See Illustration 16.)

#### **Edging:**

Around every ch on the long side crochet 3 dc, ch 2. The  $1^{st}$  dc on the rnd is 1 sc around a ch, ch 2 in the corners crochet 3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc, ch 2. End with a sl st in top of the  $1^{st}$  dc =  $2^{nd}$  ch








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











